The information in the chart indicates the requirements specified for school settings only either by the state licensure board and/or the state Department of Education.

- AL 1) and 13) Regulations to be promulgated for licensing of SLPAs allowing services in both school and private practice but not hospital settings.
- **AZ** 6) Speech Language Technicians have no supervision requirements.
 - 13) Speech-language technicians must complete 180 clock hours of graduate level coursework every six years.
- CA 6) Bachelors degree in SLP or communication disorders fulfills equivalency standard for assistants. Board may consider 9 months FT experience in lieu of field or bachelor's clinical experience.
 - 10) Aides do not need formal academic or clinical training and must be directly supervised.
- **CO** 4) Department of Education provides an authorization.
- CT 5) Unlicensed but in laws.
- **DE** (11) Ratios have not yet passed in regulations as of 10/24.
 - (13) Continuing education requirements have not yet been passed in regulations as of 10/24.
- GA 2) Registration for SLP Aides is not required in schools if no fees are charged for services.
 - 10) As an alternative to an Associate's degree, a paraprofesional may have two years of college coursework or passed a PSC approved paraprofessional assessment (with a high school diploma or GED).
