

**National Summary Report: Descriptive Statistics of PRAXIS Examination Scores for the
Speech-Language Pathology Specialty Test for Test Administration Years
September 2014 – August 2015 through September 2024 – August 2025**

The following tables present descriptive statistics on the PRAXIS speech-language pathology test on the highest score only (i.e., excludes multiple scores for a given individual) for all exam participants (Table 1) and for those individuals who have earned a bachelor’s degree plus additional credits, earned a master’s degree, earned a master’s degree plus additional credits, or earned a doctoral degree (Table 2) for test administration years *September 2014 – August 2015* through *September 2024 – August 2025* and who have identified ASHA as a score recipient.
