




- MIPPA 2008
 - Medicare Improvements for Patients and Providers Act of 2008 (MIPAA)
 - allows private-practice speech-language pathologists to bill Medicare Part B starting July 1, 2009
- Final Medicare Physician Fee Schedule (MPFS) 2009
 - SLPs can enroll as Medicare providers on or after June 2, 2009
 - New regulations for participation in Medicare
 - Mirror physical therapy regulations, except no provision for assistants




- Regulations in MPFS
 - An SLP can provide services in one of the following practice types:
 - An unincorporated solo practice, partnership, or group practice, or a professional corporation or other incorporated speech-language pathology practice
 - An employee of a physician group
 - An employee of a group that is not a professional corporation



- An SLP can provide services in the following locations:
 - The SLP's private office space. The space must be owned, rented, or leased by the practice and used exclusively for the practice.
 - The patient's home, not including any institution that is a hospital, a critical access hospital, or a skilled nursing facility




- ASHA recommendations
 - Encourage CMS to include in regulations use of assistants
 - Encourage CMS to include in regulations ability to provide services to patients in natural environment
 - Provide members with resources for enrollment and Medicare billing



An NPI Number is a *Prerequisite* to Medicare Enrollment


- A National Provider Identifier is required for all direct-bill practitioners under Medicare.
- Private health plans may require the NPI only for practitioners who directly bill electronically.

NPI, contd.

- Taxonomy code for SLPs (Level II classification)
 - 235Z00000X
- Provider Type: 23
- Include legacy identifiers for other payers
 - Provider #'s that already identify you with other health insurance plans

- If the practice is under your name or "Doing Business As," or
- You are billing as sole owner of a professional corp., professional association, or limited liability company
- Effective for SLP services rendered July 1, 2009









To Enroll as a Group/Organization: Form CMS-855B


- You complete the 855B
- Each employee/contractor (SLP/OT/PT):
 - completes the <u>855i</u> if not already active in Medicare Part B
 - Completes the <u>855R</u> "Reassignment of Medicare Benefits"
 - names the practice owner or corporation as the recipient of Medicare payments



Related CMS Forms

Can be submitted with the 855i:

- CMS-460 "Participating Physician or Supplier Agreement"
 - You agree to accept payment directly from Medicare instead of the patient (except for the patient's 20% copayment)
- CMS-588 "Authorization Agreement for Electronic Funds Transfers"
 - Allows payment directly to your bank account
