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2024 Member and Affiliate Profile

Overall Counts

ASHA currently represents 241,023 members and affiliates: audiologists; speech-language pathologists (SLPs); speech, language, and hearing scientists; audiology and speech-language pathology support personnel; and undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students in communication sciences and disorders (CSD) who are members of the National Student Speech Language Hearing Association (NSSLHA). ASHA's membership and affiliation grew by 6,779 people in 2024—a 2.9% increase from the previous year.

Counts by Membership or Affiliation Status

- Audiologists, SLPs, and Speech, Language, and Hearing Scientists. Excluding assistants and National NSSLHA members, ASHA represents 229,737 CSD professionals—up from 223,057 at year-end 2023 (a 3.0% increase).
- Certified Audiologists. ASHA represents 14,177 audiologists—up from 14,059 at year-end 2023 (a 0.8% increase). Most (93.2%) audiologists are certified members.
- Certified Speech-Language Pathologists. ASHA represents 212,864 SLPs—up from 206,126 at year-end 2023 (a 3.3% increase). Most (97.4%) SLPs are certified members.
- Individuals With Dual Certification. ASHA represents 610 individuals who hold certification in both audiology
 and speech-language pathology—down from 645 at year-end 2023 (a 5.4% decline). Individuals with dual
 certification are counted separately from individuals certified in audiology or speech-language pathology only.
- Individuals With Certification in Process. The number of individuals who have started—but not yet completed—the certification process is 1,298—down from 1,747 at year-end 2023 (a 25.7% decline).
- Members Only. Only 559 ASHA members do not hold certification—including 169 life time members—slightly up from 555, which included 162 life time members, at year-end 2023 (a 0.7% increase).
- International Affiliates. ASHA represents 564 CSD professionals from 69 countries outside the United States—compared to 575 professionals from 67 countries at year-end 2023 (a 1.9% decrease).
- Certified Assistants. ASHA represents 1,123 assistants—up significantly from 881 at year-end 2023 (a 27.5% increase). Of these, 50 are certified in audiology, 1,015 are certified in speech-language pathology, and 58 have started—but not yet completed—the Assistants Certification Program.
- National NSSLHA Members. ASHA represents 10,163 students who are members of National NSSLHA—down slightly from 10,306 at year-end 2023 (a 1.4% decrease).

Demographics

- Sex. Overall, most (95.6%) ASHA members and affiliates self-identify as female—the same as year-end 2023. About 12.1% of audiologists, 3.5% of SLPs, and 16.2% of those with dual certification self-identify as male.
- Race and Ethnicity. About 9.8% of ASHA members and affiliates self-identify as racially minoritized groups. Additionally, 7.3% of ASHA members and affiliates self-identify as Hispanic, Latina, Latino, Latinx, or as being of Spanish origin. In contrast, 38.4% of the U.S. population self-identify as racially minoritized groups; 18.7% self-identify as Hispanic or Latino (U.S. Census Bureau, 2020).
- Age. ASHA members and affiliates who are age 34 and younger (25.8%) and age 35–44 (29.3%) make up over half of the Association, followed by those who are 45–54 (23.1%), 55–64 (13.3%), and 65 and older (8.5%).
- **Disability.** About 2.6% (5,907) of ASHA members and affiliates self-identify as having a disability. Of these, 1.3% (2,947) self-identify as having a speech-language disability, 0.7% (1,671) a mental or emotional disability, 0.5% (1,049) an auditory disability, 0.3% (790) a motor-mobility disability, and 0.1% (331) a visual disability (data for this bullet do not appear in any table).

Employment Characteristics

- Employment Status. Overall, most (74.7%) ASHA members and affiliates work full time; 16.0% work part time. Only 1.1% are unemployed and seeking work.
- Primary Employment Facility—Audiologists. Most (75.8%) audiologists work in health care settings, including
 hospitals, as well as residential and nonresidential health care facilities. Most of the remainder work in either
 schools (6.9%) or colleges/universities (5.9%).
- **Primary Employment Facility—SLPs.** About half (49.7%) of SLPs work in schools. Most of the remainder (40.4%) work in either health care settings, including hospitals, as well as residential and nonresidential health care facilities, or colleges/universities (2.4%).
- Private Practice. About 32.0% of audiologists and 24.3% of SLPs work full- or part time in private practice.
- Primary Employment Function. About 77.7% of audiologists and 75.9% of SLPs are clinical service providers.
 Most of the remainder are special education teachers, college/university professors, researchers, administrators, or consultants.
