


Elections Road Trip





Maine Senate







Sen. Susan Collins (R) (Incumbent)

First elected in 1996
Former Massachusetts
deputy state treasurer



Sara Gideon (D) (Dem challenger)

Maine state House speaker First elected in 2012

WHAT TO WATCH:



Following Collins' vote to confirm Brett Kavanaugh to the Supreme Court, her vote to acquit President Trump in the impeachment trial, and comments about the Ukraine scandal, Collins' approval in Maine has taken a dip. State House Speaker Sara Gideon brought in \$7.1 million in Q1 2020, compared to the \$2.41 million raised by Collins.



WHAT TO WATCH:



President Trump won NY-22 by 16 points and remains popular in the district, making Rep. Brindisi's reelection bid one of the most competitive this cycle. Brindisi will face Tenney again after ousting her in 2018, although Tenney was a polarizing figure to many moderate Republicans over the years.



First elected in 2018
First elected as a Rep for PA-17 in 2012



Jim Bognet (R) (GOP challenger)

WHAT TO WATCH:



President Trump won the district by 9 points in 2016, and now an ex-Trump administration official will lead the GOP ticket. Incumbent Matt Cartwright voted for both articles of impeachment against Trump, potentially leading him to a competitive reelection.



Scott Taylor (R) (GOP challenger)

WHAT TO WATCH:




In another rematch, Luria will face Scott Taylor, who she ousted in 2018 by only two points. Taylor had announced a run for Senate, but decided in Dec. to run for the House instead. Taylor's campaign was caught forging ballot petitions to siphon votes from Luria, although GOP strategists believe he is the best candidate to win the seat.

North Carolina Senate







Sen. Thom Tillis (R) (Incumbent)

First elected in 2014 Former state House representative



Cal Cunningham (D) (Dem challenger)

Former state senator Vice President of WasteZero

WHAT TO WATCH:



Tillis lost popularity among the state's GOP voters when he defied President Trump on emergency funding for the border wall, despite ultimately siding with the president; a recent poll found Tillis's approval rating at 26%. The first quarter of 2020, Cunningham raised over \$4 million, more than double the amount Tillis brought in.



Rep. Lucy McBath (D) (Incumbent)

First elected in 2018 Former spokeswoman for Everytown for Gun Safety



Karen Handel (R) (GOP challenger)

Former US Representative for GA-6

WHAT TO WATCH:



Rep. McBath will face Handel in the general election, setting up a rematch from 2018 when McBath ousted Handel by a 2 point margin. In 2018, McBath received almost \$4 million from Bloomberg's gun control group and was likely boosted by a higher non-white voter turnout, but a shift to the left in Atlanta suburbs could carry her to reelection.




Oklahoma's 5th District

WHAT TO WATCH:




The GOP primary runoff is on August 25. Trump won the district by 13 points in 2016, and GOP candidates can emphasize Horn's votes for Pelosi as Speaker and for impeachment. Despite this, a GOP runoff will give Horn more time to campaign without a clear opponent

WHAT TO WATCH:

Rep. Kenny Marchant (R) announced that he would not seek reelection in 2020, leaving an open seat. The district has become more diverse—it is now 46% white—and gave Trump only 51% of the vote in 2016. Van Duyne easily won the GOP primary for the seat, while Democrats are facing a messier primary.



Former attorney


Rep. Torres Small defeated incumbent Yvette Herrell by only 3,722 votes in 2018, despite President Trump carrying the district by ten points in 2016. They will face each other again in November.

WHAT TO WATCH:




In the 2018 Senate race, Kyrsten Sinema (D) beat Martha McSally, despite millions of dollars spent in negative ads against Sinema. McSally was later appointed to the Senate following the death of John McCain, making the incumbency effect less beneficial for her. Republican strategists have also said Mark Kelly is the Dem's best recruit this cycle.

Former Colorado state House Speaker

WHAT TO WATCH:



Democrats won the state in the past three presidential elections and the state currently has a Democratic trifecta, with a Dem. governor and legislature. However, Gardner has received a significant amount of spending on his behalf from NRSC, the Senate Leadership Fund, and the Senate Majority PAC.



Rep. Cindy Axne (D) (Incumbent)

First elected in 2018
Former businesswoman



David Young (R) (GOP challenger)

Former US Representative for IA-3

WHAT TO WATCH:



Rep. Axne and David Young will face off again after Axne ousted Young in the 2018 blue wave. President Trump won the district by four points in 2016, although the district is more metropolitan than the surrounding districts. Young has aligned himself with Trump this cycle, and so his success will hinge on the president's approval in November.




Illinois' 13th District

Rep. Rodney Davis (R) (Incumbent)

First elected in 2012 Former projects director for a congressman



Betsy Londrigan (D) (Dem challenger)

Former 2018 candidate for IL-13 seat Non-profit fundraiser

WHAT TO WATCH:



Rep. Davis barely won his reelection bid against Londrigan in 2018, setting up a competitive rematch for 2020. Londrigan had more cash on hand at the end of March than Davis and has outspent him this cycle.


