
The Why, What, and How of Interprofessional Collaboration

INTRODUCTION

Do you have the skills to succeed on interprofessional teams in a health care or education environment? In this webinar, you will learn the why, what, and how of interprofessional education and interprofessional collaborative practice. The course will explore this often misunderstood concept for those who are unfamiliar with it and will specifically discuss how to foster collaborative teams in various work settings, different models for interprofessional collaboration, and how to identify the competencies you need to maximize your effectiveness as a member of collaborative teams.
